Adopt A Storm Drain Program- The Adopt A Storm Drain (AASD) program continues to grow with 12 new adopters and 31 new storm drains adopted since August across five participating communities and 187 cleanings reported in the last three months. If your community is interested in joining the AASD program, please contact Christal or Claudia.

Rain Barrel Sales/Reimbursements—We've sold 435 rain barrels this year with 103 MAMSWaP residents applying for reimbursements (33%). Residents from across most MAMSWaP communities have taken advantage of the reimbursement program. The rain barrel sale closed on Oct. 31st and will open again in May 2026. Christal is working with Earthmark to determine costs for 2026 and restock our supply over the winter.

<u>Leaf-free Streets for Clean Waters</u>- An updated outreach toolkit was shared with partners in September. To date five rain alerts have been issued (Oct. 5th, 13th, 16th, 20th, and 31st). Rain alert email subscribers are up to 567 and text subscribers are at 716, an increase of 121 subscribers in 2025. City of Verona and City of Sun Prairie have requested custom yard signs and outreach tools. An additional 20 Dane County residents have requested yard signs, mostly from Madison and Middleton.

Storm Drain Murals Update- Mark Fraire with Dane Arts helped us connect with a new artist, Rodrigo Carapia, to take over the Storm Drain Mural program in 2026. Rodrigo has lots of experience working with school age students on designing and painting murals and is excited to partner with us on this project. The 2026 Storm Drain Mural applications will be available in Dec. and due Feb. 15th. If you know of a group/school that might be interested in applying, please encourage them to contact Christal to get help finding a suitable mural location.

Online Rain Garden/Native Garden Course-We recently met with UW Extension staff about partnering on a self-led on Rain Garden/Native Garden course. The idea is to create a flexible course with various modules covering specific native gardening topics as a lot of the information needed to prep, design and maintain native gardens is the same for various types of gardens. Participants would complete specific modules pertaining to the type of native garden they are interested in, pollinator, rain garden, downspout gardens, etc. Following completion of the course, we hope to offer students additional resources to encourage action, possibly a free site visit or reimbursement for plants/materials.

Nature in Session-Stormwater Exploration Programs- We will continue to offer up to 20 FREE Nature in Session Stormwater Exploration Programs for MAMSWaP partners through Lussier Family Heritage Center this year. Nature in Session brings programming out to the community (schools, libraries, camps). Sessions normally cost \$50 each, but MAMSWaP members can request up to 3 Stormwater Exploration sessions free of charge. Please share with schools and libraries in your communities.
