MAMSWaP Newsletter/Reminders- Sent out May 9th.

<u>Rain Gardens Coaching Session Reimbursements</u> – 11 of the 26 Rain Garden Coaching Session participants applied for and received up to \$50 Plant Dane native plant reimbursements. Applications were due by July 12<sup>th</sup>. 9 applications were from City of Madison residents, 1 from Verona, and 1 from Sun Prairie. Types of gardens installed: 9 rain gardens\*, 9 downspout gardens and 2 native gardens. \*Two additional rain gardens reported, but participants did not apply for a reimbursement.

<u>Storm Drain Murals Update</u>- Five new murals were painted this summer. Two of the five repaints are also completed. The remaining three repaints will be completed in August. Sonya Sankaran, our current artist, is unable to continue with the program next year. Christal is working with Dane Arts Mural Arts and/or Dane Arts to explore partnership opportunities for 2025.

Rain Barrel Sales/Reimbursements—We've sold almost 400 rain barrels this year with 86 MAMSWaP residents applying for reimbursements (31%). Residents from across most MAMSWaP communities have taken advantage of the reimbursement program. Cost is \$82 with a \$30 reimbursement for MAMSWaP residents. Rain barrel sales will continue through October unless supply runs out.

Adopt A Storm Drain Program- The Adopt A Storm Drain (AASD) program continues to grow with 22 new adopters and 53 new storm drains adopted in the last six month across seven of the eight participating communities and 153 cleanings reported in the last three months. Thank you mailings were sent in early June to active volunteers with a homemade card and voucher for a free Lussier Heritage Center program. All AASD volunteers were also invited to our upcoming Dane County LWRD/Parks Volunteer Picnic on Sept. 9<sup>th</sup>. We're always looking for ways to recognize volunteers and keep them engaged! If your community is interested in joining the AASD program, please contact Christal or Claudia.

Nature in Session-Stormwater Exploration Programs- Two communities have taken advantage of our free Stormwater Exploration Programs through Lussier Family Heritage Center this year. Nature in Session brings programming out to the community (schools, libraries, camps). Sessions normally cost \$50 each, but MAMSWaP members can request up to 3 Stormwater Exploration sessions free of charge. We have funding to pay for up to 16 additional sessions in 2025. <u>WI Stormwater Week 2025 (Sept. 20<sup>th</sup>-28<sup>th</sup>)</u>- This year the statewide planning team is asking groups to plan local clean-up events around the state. We're working on planning a few local clean-ups and/or partnering with other groups that have local clean-up events already planned here in Dane Co. If you know of a

shoreline/waterbodies in your community that could benefit from a fall clean-up and are willing to partner on an event during Stormwater Week, please contact Christal or Claudia. WI Stormwater Week plans also include four webinars and a social media campaign directing people to local resources and programs.
